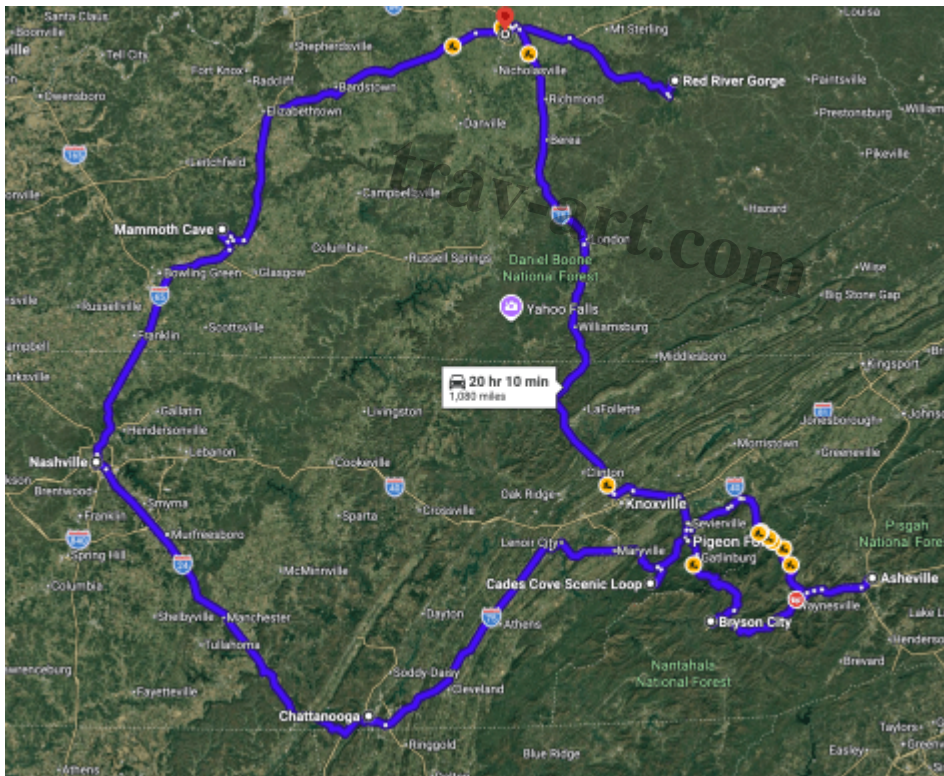


Kentucky, Tennessee and North Carolina

Day 1 → 2: Lexington / Red River Gorge, Kentucky

Theme: Horse country + dramatic sandstone wilderness

Fly into **Lexington**

Day 1

- Tour horse farms
- Wander downtown Lexington
- Bourbon tasting if desired
- Nice dinner in the historic district

Day 2

Drive to **Red River Gorge**

This is one of the most underrated outdoor areas in America:

- natural sandstone arches
- cliff overlooks
- forest hollows
- excellent hiking

Why it works for glamping:

This area screams boutique cabins / elevated canvas tents.

Think:

- cedar hot tubs
- forest decks
- lantern-lit pathways

Stay:

Luxury cabin or upscale tent near Slade.

Day 3: Mammoth Cave Region



Drive west to **Mammoth Cave National Park**

Massive change in scenery:

- karst landscapes
- hidden rivers
- cave systems
- quiet woods

Do:

- cave tour
- canoeing
- easy hikes

Glamping insight:

This is more family adventure tourism than romance luxury??but strong potential.

Day 4??5: Nashville + Tennessee Countryside

Drive to **Nashville**

Nashville day

- Broadway
- Country Music Hall of Fame
- rooftop dinner

Then escape the city.

Stay in countryside 45??90 minutes outside Nashville:

- Leipers Fork area
- wooded boutique cabin
- luxury farm stay

This gives:

urban + retreat pairing

Good business lesson:

A glamping resort near a major metro can print money if positioned right.

Day 6??7: Chattanooga

Drive to **Chattanooga**

This city punches way above its weight.

Do:

- Lookout Mountain
- Rock City
- Ruby Falls
- Tennessee River waterfront
- great food scene

Nearby scenery:

- cliffs
- waterfalls
- hardwood forests

Resort scouting angle:

Strong. Very strong.

Less saturated than Gatlinburg.

Day 8&??9: Smoky Mountains



Drive into:

Great Smoky Mountains National Park

Base options:

- Townsend (quiet side)
- Gatlinburg (touristy chaos)
- Bryson City (more authentic)
- Cherokee

Best glamping experience:

Townsend or Bryson City

Do:

- Cades Cove
- mountain drives
- elk spotting
- river tubing
- scenic overlooks

This is probably the most obvious glamping market in the Southeast.

But:

competition is fierce.

Day 10-11: Asheville / Blue Ridge North Carolina

Drive to **Asheville**

This is luxury mountain glamping central.

Do:

- Blue Ridge Parkway
- Biltmore exterior grounds
- breweries
- art district
- waterfalls

Nearby mountain towns:

- Black Mountain
 - Hendersonville
 - Brevard
-

This region is gorgeous.

Glamping customers here pay for:

- soaking tubs
- mountain views
- curated interiors
- wellness packages

If your future resort is meant to be upscale, this market is the benchmark.

Optional Add-On (Highly Recommended)

Nantahala / Bryson City

Instead of extra Asheville time:

Go west to:

Bryson City

Do:

- Nantahala Gorge
- rafting
- train ride
- mountain sunsets

This area feels more adventurous and less polished.

Potential resort vibe:

luxury explorer lodge

Rough Route

Lexington → Red River Gorge → Mammoth Cave → Nashville → Chattanooga → Smokies → Bryson City → Asheville

1,100-1,300 road miles

4) Chattanooga

Vibe: Outdoor adventure with less competition

This might be the sleeper pick.

Why:

- cliffs
- waterfalls
- riverfront city
- climbing/hiking culture

Business angle:

Potentially less saturated than Smokies while still being highly desirable.

This one really intrigues me.

5) Great Smoky Mountains National Park

Vibe: Massive demand / intense competition

Pros:

- endless tourism
- mountain beauty
- strong occupancy potential

Cons:

- everyone already knows this
- lots of competitors
- some areas feel over-commercialized

Best sub-areas:

- Townsend
- Bryson City
- quieter NC side

Avoid if you hate tourist chaos:
Gatlinburg/Pigeon Forge.

6) Asheville

Vibe: Premium mountain luxury

This is where people pay for:

- soaking tubs
- designer interiors
- spa packages
- curated experiences
- mountain views

Benchmark market for upscale glamping.

If your vision is:

this is your inspiration zone.

- curated guest experiences

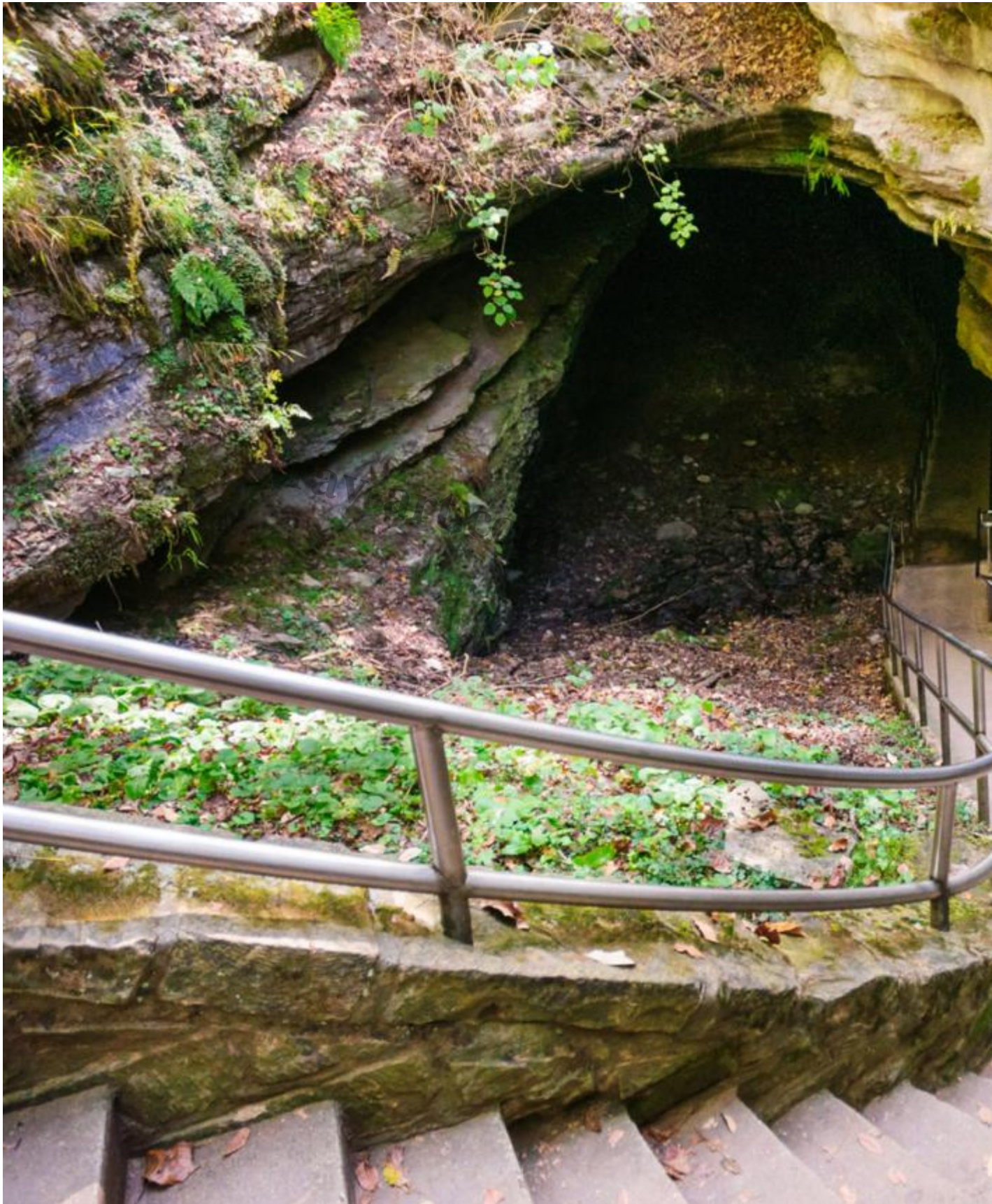
Activities:
